Bryden Grant Call for Proposals

Guidelines for Bryden Grants:

- 1. One \$1,000 grant is in the NCAS 2014-15 budget for research equipment and/or expenses related to attending scientific conferences. Past recipients are not eligible.
- 2. Both the applicant and the research advisor must be at a college or university in North Carolina and members of the NCAS in good standing (membership forms may be obtained from the address listed below or at web sitehttp://www.ncacadsci.org). Please note that this grant program is funded through dues paid by NCAS members. In order to continue this and other valuable NCAS programs, research advisors are encouraged to request their institutions to contribute through an institutional membership.
- 3. Applications for the grant must include one copy of the following:
 - NCAS proposal cover sheet form with one page budget summary. Itemize as specifically as possible.
 - Extended abstract of research no longer than 2 pages with three sections.
 - I. Introduction: Background, significance and clear statement of purpose.
 - II. Results: Brief summary of experimental results to date.
 - III. Planned Research: Brief description of work planned over the next year.

Deadline for applications is February 27, 2015.

Save the Date - NCAS 2015 Annual Meeting

The 2015 Annual Meeting of the NCAS will be held March 27-28 in Wake Forest Biotech Place, the first of the newly renovated Reynolds Tobacco Co. factory complex. This complex is now the Wake Forest Innovation Quarter of Winston-Salem, NC, developed by the Wexford Corp, a leader in research park design and development. WF Biotech Place houses Wake Forest University Health Sciences laboratories, but also commercial endeavors and a Conference Center that is ideal for the NCAS meeting. Our theme for the meeting is 'Innovation in Research', highly appropriate for the venue. Special session topics of interest will include workforce development led by the National Center for the Biotechnology Workforce, and academic collaborations supported by the expansion of the Center for Design Innovation. Workshops are designed to demonstrate how academic researchers have commercialized their discoveries or developed their own companies based upon their scholarly activities. There will be opportunities for students who present their work to interact with research post-doctoral fellows at Wake Forest University.


